Bags MUST be dumped on the pile by the "Yard Waste" sign .

Empty, used bags can be placed in waste containers for disposal

C Yard Waste & Curbside Chipping

Place cut ends toward street. Bundle brush with string.

Bills will be sent for chipping in excess of 5 minutes.

Curbside Chipping is NOT intended for tree removal.

GUIDELINES FOR RECYCLING

Per the Village of Edgar Mandatory Recycling Ordinance, the following information applies to single-family and 2-4 family residences. Business and apartment buildings may have different guidelines.

	What Do I Recycle?	Cleaning and Preparation	What Can't Be Recycled?
Glass	All colors of whole glass bottles & jars	RINSE CLEAN Remove and discard caps & lids	<u>NO Broken</u> bottles, ceramics, jars, Pyrex, all other glass including windows & mirrors - place in garbage.
Metals	Aluminum & Tin Food Cans & Clean Foil	RINSE CLEAN Flatten, if possible	<u>NO</u> foil food packaging, aluminum pots/pans, aerosol cans, metal hangers, etc. – place in garbage.
Plastics #1-#7 & Aseptic Containers	Cartons/boxes used for juice drinks, milk, ice cream, broths, etc.	RINSE CLEAN Remove caps, lids & neck rings Flatten, if possible	<u>NO</u> motor oil & pesticide containers, plastic film, shrink wrap or bags, CD cases, #1 brown plastic bottles, #6 polystyrene foam (Styrofoam, i.e., egg carton, hot beverage cups, plates, formed packing pieces, packing peanuts, etc.) or vinyl items such as windows & siding - place in garbage.
Plastics #3-#7	Food/beverage containers, cat litter containers, ice cream pails, 5-gallon pails, medicine/pill containers, bakery containers, flower pots/trays, yogurt/cottage cheese containers, cups & tubs, clear & rigid clam shell packaging and small plastic toys	RINSE CLEAN Remove caps, lids & neck rings Flatten, if possible	
Plastics #3-#7 LARGE	None	Will <u>NOT</u> be collected with regular curbside recycling.	<u>NO</u> 15-gallon containers, 55-gallon drums, large plastic furniture & toys. These items MUST be delivered to the Marathon County MRF for recycling at no charge to the resident.
Paper	Cardboard and cardboard w/wavy middle Books (hardcover & paperbacks), catalogs, container board (cereal, soda & tissue boxes), egg cartons (paper only), envelopes, grocery bags, junk mail, magazines, newsprint, paper rolls & tubes, office paper (white, colored, shredded, etc.) and non-metallic wrapping paper.	Flatten and bundle to approximately 9" in height and no larger than 4 sq ft. Small quantities do not have to be tied. Place in container clearly marked "RECYCLING" secured in weather. Brown paper bags may be used if they are bagged on both ends and tied. If it is raining/snowing on recycling day, do not put out until next pick up.	<u>NO</u> cardboard or paper coated with wax, metallic wrapping paper, carbon paper, facial tissue, greasy food containers, paper plates and paper towels, dog food bags, etc. – place in garbage. Do <u>NOT</u> use plastic bags. Wet paper is not recyclable.
Waste Oil	Auto & Truck engine oil only.	Place in sturdy capped 1-gallon container labeled "OIL" and place it curbside for pick up.	<u>NO</u> used oil, gas or antifreeze containers – place in garbage.
Batteries	Auto and 12V batteries		<u>NO</u> 6V batteries
E-Waste Sept. 1, 2010, electronics have been banned by Wisconsin law from landfills and incinerators.	Consumer computers, printers, printer/fax/copier/scanner combinations, video displays, keyboards, mice, hard drives, fax machines, DVD players, VCR & other video players, phones w/video displays, cell phones and fluorescent and incandescent light bulbs.	Most electronics contain some level of potentially harmful substances, including lead, mercury, cadmium, chromium, heavy metals and chemical flame retardants. These chemicals can enter groundwater, surface water or air where they pose a risk to human and environmental health if incinerated or put in the landfill. <u>CANNOT BE PLACED AT CURB SIDE</u> and MUST BE TAKEN TO ADVANCED DISPOSAL at 5509 Fuller Street, Weston NOTE: There is a fee associated with E-Waste items.	

Glass, Metals and #1 and #2 Plastics may be co-mingled with the container clearly marked "RECYCLING".
